Dress Code

Wearing Of Dress Code

Wearing of dress code is school policy and has the support of the P&C and SDMG. Families with objection to school dress code need to state their objections, in writing, to the Principal.

To encourage student participation staff also have a school uniform. School Councillors and other children holding offices of responsibility are expected to wear uniforms at all times.

Classes on excursions are, unless told otherwise, expected to be in uniform.

The school has a policy of “no hat - no play” in the sun during 1st and 4th terms.

Dress Code

White polo shirt (skivvy in Winter) - logo preferred

Bottle green shorts

Green tartan skirt for girls (box pleated skirt optional for years 6 and 7 only)

Summer dresses (checked material, as available from the P&C uniform shop)

Bottle green cycle pants (cotton preferred for health reasons). Cycle pants to be worn only under skirts

Fashion shorts, in bottle green, are an option for girls.

Tracksuit pants, or tights worn under skirts, in bottle green

White socks (with fully enclosed shoes) Sandals are acceptable but thongs, masseurs and surf sandals are discouraged for safety reasons

Hats are encouraged at all times when students are outside.

Uniforms are available from the School Uniform Shop on Tuesday Morning from 8.15am to 9.00am and Thursday Afternoon from 2.30pm to 3.15pm.

Secondhand Uniforms

Donations of clean secondhand uniforms are always accepted by the school for resale. Please contact the school or ladies in the Uniform Shop on Wednesday mornings between 8.15am - 9.15am.

Footwear

Sandals or shoes, sneakers and socks are recommended. Rubber thongs, shoes with high heels or plastic shoes are not acceptable as school footwear. For physical education and sport lessons suitable footwear is required.

Hair

By regulation, children who have collar length hair (both girls and boys) must have it either plaited or tied back, while attending school. This is a health and safety measure and also minimises risk of head lice infection.

Parents are urged to check their child’s hair regularly for head lice. If found the child must not return to school until proper treatment has been carried out. For further advice contact the school or your local chemist.

Jewellery

The wearing of jewellery is not permitted for safety reasons. Studs or sleepers are the only acceptable earrings permitted.
